## PROJECTS IN PROGRESS

#### AGED CARE - Facility Manager/Registered Nurse

Aged Care Hostel's FM/RN Contract expired on the 16<sup>th</sup> January 2024.

Your Nursing Agency (YNA) is engaged to provide coverage for a period of three months or until the position is advertised and a successful candidate appointed. Peak Services was engaged to help council find talented professionals, one candidate was shortlisted and an inteview was held on the 15<sup>th</sup> February 2024.

#### **Status**

Negotiations are in progress with a potential candidate

#### **Hope Vale Community Market**

The Hope Vale Community Market is scheduled for it's first opening on the Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> February 2024, 8am-12pm at the Cultural Park. Hope Vale Community Markets will continue every last Saturday of the calendar month.

#### **EASTER Program**

A range of activities include arts and crafts, basketball, futsal, swimming carnival, laser tag, edor, cooking activities and touch football will be delivered during the easter school holiday period. Activities will be combined with our community breakfast and easter egg hunt.

#### **Status**

Program to be finalised and posted onto Council's facebook page. Equipments to support an effective program are being sourced.

#### **Central Rodeo Association**

As reported in the November 2023 Social Services Report, the Director of Social Services has now obtained a quote to hold a function in March 2024. Following direction from Council meeting held in January 2024 potential dates between the month of July – Setpember are being sourced.

A risk assessment is currently being undertaken and will be finalised and reported in the next Council meeting.

#### **Hope Vale Music and Cultural Festival 2023**

Meeting held with Queensland Music Festival to source a potential celebration to be hosted in Hope Vale.

Status

A project plan to be developed in scope of an event to source funding to support with an event.

# Remote and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Aged Care Service Development Assistance Panel (SDAP)

An application was submitted to the organisation on the 6th November 2023 to seek assistance and support from consultants through the Service Development assistance panel to review the management and governance of the aged care services with the view to developing an integrated model of aged care that will be financially viable in the new aged care regulatory framework. The Director of Scoial Services has been notified that due to competing priorities late last year the department was unable to progress the SDAP application. A request to schedule a meeting was held on the 18th January to discuss the application further.


#### **National Disability Insurance Agency**

Agreement executed


Nola's Place Child Care Centre is licensed for twenty – nine (29) children fulltime. (0 to 2 years – 8 and 2 to 5 years – 21).



#### **Good News**

On Friday 9<sup>th</sup> February 2024, Nola's Place celebrated the graduation of three students who completed their Certificate III in Children's Services.

**George Bowen Memorial Kindergarten** is licensed for twenty – five (25) children of kindergarten age. The children attend on Monday-Wednesday 9:00am-2:30pm.



Warm welcoming to parents and guardians to support their children go through this new chapter of their lives.

#### **Youth Engagement Program**

The Hope Vale Youth and Social Support Project is funded by the Federal Government to "Engage, Refer and Assist" Youth in our community.

Programme/Activities for after school has commenced for children returning back to school. Multi activities suitable to the needs of children are being delivered. However due to weather and heat wave experienced the swimming pool has had a high turnover of children participating.

#### Engagement

Currently working closely with FRC to provide support with an identified child who needs to return to an educational institute. Option are being discussed and care plan is being formalised.

Recruitment of Youth Engagement Officer is scheduled for the 20th February 2024.

#### Maintenance

Multipurpose Centre is awaiting of star link to arrive and installed at the facility. This service will give the staff members access to the system.

#### **Swimming Pool & Splash Park**





**Maintenance** – Installation of new ladder in the pool has been installed however the ladder is not firm and requires to be fixed to ensure safety is upheld at the pool. The Splash park pump was fixed however this has been reported to have crashed again.

#### Mum's and Bubs Classes

Tailored to support mum's and bubs swimming classes with our qualified instructor Class Times:

Wednesday 2:30pm – 3:00pm

#### **Dry Land Swimming Program**

Dry Land Swimming program involves activities, scenarios and games that incorporate all aspects of swimming and water safety.

Program will commence in April 2024 with children/educators at the Kindergarten and Daycare.

#### Gym&Fitness

Gym & Fitness Centre's membership for the month

- 51 Members
- 1 Under 18

The gym & fitness centre has seen a volume of increased participation at the facility. Members have also engaged in group fitness classes conducted by our qualified trainer.

National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) Community Connector

The Remote Community Connector Program aims to "engage, inform and assist" people living in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander remote communities through the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) Connector

The NDIS Community Connector's Office is based in the Radio Station building.

Engagement has occurred with before and after cyclone Jasper event in the 2023. This was to ensure that clients are safe and prepared for the event.

Community Connector has engaged with appropriate service providers to ensure continuity of care for participants.

- 28 Active Participants
- 6 Centacare participants
- 22 ITEC participants

#### **Indigenous Radio Station**

The Communications and Media Centre is funded by the Federal Government. Currently we have two (2) community people employed at the Radio Station – a senior broadcaster and a junior broadcaster.

As reported in the January 2024 Social Services Report a new UPS (uninterruptible power supply) battery is required to be purchased to replace the old battery.

#### **Status**

Equipments purchased

DW IT Consulting service will be engaged to install the equipments at the Radio Station.

#### **Commonwealth Home Support Program (CHSP)**

The Commonwealth Home Support Program helps the frail, older people living in Hope Vale to maximise their independence whilst still being able to live in their homes. This program is funded by the Federal Government and works closely with the State Government Department of Health

We currently provide the below community services:

Yard Maintenance: An external contractor engaged to provide yard maintenance service to our CHSP clients.

#### **Aged Care Hostel**

The Aged Care Facility is regulated under the Aged Care Act 1997 and is federally funded. The Hostel is a 20 bed facility with occupancy levels fluctuating over the last 12 months. The service boasts a fantastic and dedicated team of local staff providing culturally appropriate care to residents in their own community.
