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# Remote Jobs and Economic Development Intergovernmental Approach

The Community Development Program (CDP) is an existing remote employment and community development service administered by the National Indigenous Australians Agency (NIAA). CDP is being replaced by Remote Jobs and Economic Development (RJED) and National Remote Employment Services (NRES) from July 2025. CDP and future programs aim to support job seekers and businesses in remote Australia to build skills, address barriers to employment and contribute to their communities through activities and training.

Collaboration between the NDIA, NIAA and DTATSIPCA will support people in remote communities to move into meaningful jobs and develop businesses that communities want, while improving the participation, experience, and outcomes of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander NDIS participants.

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
#### Care Sector Demand & NDIS Provider data overview

The Care Sector Demand Map Provides data on current NDIS and Aged Care participation levels, spending, and services, to help inform provider business decisions and encourage growth in areas where it's needed. Broader provider coverage can strengthen markets and ensure people are able to access the care they need now and, into the future.

Far North QLD is one of the top 3 regions in Australia with highest NDIS service demand growth forecasts. The projected growth of 121% over the 3 years from FY 2022-2023 to FY 2025-2026, indicates that the forecasted service demand is more than double the current service demand.
